Minutes of the meeting of the BCA Town Amenities Sub-Committee held on **Tuesday 19 February 2013** at 8 pm at 15 Shrublands Avenue, Berkhamsted.

1. Minutes of the meeting of 15 January 2013 were agreed.

2. Matters arising

2.1 PC asked TASC members to look at the new style of bus stop timetable panels being installed and give their views at the next meeting. In PC's view, the displays are too small.

3. Planning and Environment

- 3.1 Reference last meeting, Minute 2.1, sign at Alsford Wharf, Castle Street, SJ had contacted the Enforcement Officer (James Henderson) at DBC. Mr. Henderson advised that the sign has deemed consent under class 2A (An advertisement displayed for the purpose of identification, direction, or warning with respect to the land or building it is displayed) Conditions are imposed on size (must not exceed 0.3 sq. metres in area) and not be illuminated. The size of the sign is 0.2806m in area and there is no illumination, hence no action can be taken.
- 3.2 10 Shrublands Avenue (4/00014/13/FHA) SJ had written to DBC Conservation Officer to comment on the unsuitability of using a 'composite' door in the Conservation Area. Noted that the Town Council had echoed BCAs view. **Note**
- 3.3 Reference the Tring, Northchurch and Berkhamsted Urban Transport Plan, the content and summary was discussed. It was decided that it was not necessary for BCA to submit comments on the consultation and would wait to comment on more 'concrete' proposals. **Note**
- 3.4 Reference the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) GB to submit a formal representation to DBC to protest at the punitive CIL rates proposed for Berkhamsted.

- 3.5 Plans were reviewed for weeks of 30 January and 6/13 February. Note
- 3.5.1 Barclays Bank facade (4/00092/13/ADV). Decided to leave the action on this to the Conservation Officer at DBC. **Note**

- 3.5.2 Road Adverts on Roundabouts on Chesham Rd/ by-pass junctions (4/00073/13/ADV and 4/000091/13/ADV).
 SJ to write to DBC to object on grounds of advertisement, large signs in rural setting, distraction to drivers.
- 3.5.3 Waitrose 'plant and flower stall' (4/00207/13/FUL) TASC did not understand the need to apply for Planning permission, and could not find grounds to object on planning grounds. BE had spoken to the store manager who advised this was a head office edict, with no local control. Note
- 3.5.4 Halifax Bank façade (4/00234/13/ADV)
 SJ to write to DBC to object on grounds of internal illumination of facades in the Conservation Area, and adjacent to a listed building (Town Hall). Some errors in the Application would also be pointed out.
- 3.6 Kitchener's Field astroturf pitch: GB noted the piece in the Gazette reporting that Berkhamsted School intended to take the decision on their Planning Application to Appeal. No further action from BCA at this stage. **Note**
